11	Agency updates.		

1. IQCS Operations Update

- Getting backup server/recovery site back on-line
- New servers are being put in place
- New website will be up and running, possibly as early as this fall
 - PMU will help with some document cleanup to ensure 508 compliance
- Still making preparations for the IQCS system upgrade
 - Upgrade expected to come May 2015
 - Demo environment will come first
 - Will have to implement a freeze date to halt activity to allow for transition

Action: Will discuss changes from the upgrade at the next meeting.

- Online training modules will be available for an Alpha review soon
- IQCS and IQS data exchange functionality is working well and the FAQs are available on the website
- Vice-Morgen PD has been classified and they are currently seeking approval to advertise and fill the position

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- Marley is doing the business side of DOI All Hazard
- Some questions remain about courses and course codes
- Qualifications for the Incident Position Qualifications Guide (IPQG) are nearly fully entered, with a few exceptions:
 - Positions that have multiple qualifications pathways have not been entered yet
 - Positions with multiple pathways = HYBRID POSITIONS
 - There are some potential options for accommodating hybrid positions in the application
 - Estimated to require about 1 week to implement hybrid pathways

Action: IQCS staff will begin testing hybrid pathways now and will report back to the CMB before the Fall meeting.

- Bureau of Reclamation has trained account managers and is entering responders, but having some issues with unit IDs.
 - · Will be entered by June 30

2. DOI All Hazard Update

- Bureau of Safety and Energy Enforcement (BSEE) and Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) are currently building Org Codes/Unit Ids in the system. BSEE is working on a pilot project with the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center (AICC) for mobilization of Alaska-based BSEE employees
- USGS is working on a pilot project using 12-18 employees that currently go on fires. Dispatch
 architecture is planned to mobilize USGS employees through a single-point in Reston, VA.
 The pilot will be with help from FWS, which will manage their IQCS and host USGS
 mobilization.
 - · Would be dispatched by a single point out of Arlington until USGS can move to Reston.
 - · About 8,000 employees
 - Many technical specialists

- The DOI One Health group, an interdepartmental team focused on disease and emergency management, is identifying technical specialists positions that are currently not part of the IPQG
 - Examining how they will apply ICS to public health incidents
 - Will be under the DOI license count

3. <u>Discipline specific endorsements</u>

- OWDC going to meet and talk about endorsements in two weeks.
- FEMA has reorganized many of the work groups that were working on qualification issues and not made progress with endorsements
- Tony is proposing to move forward and implement a discipline specific endorsement framework in the DOI and NWCG to set the example for other users
- IQCS will be relatively east to re-tool to accommodate endorsements once details are agreed upon
 - Could take up to 6 months to fully implement in IQCS
- ROSS has not been approached formally to determine feasibility and timeframes of endorsement implementation
- IQS is pushing for endorsements as well
 Decision: Topic will be tabled until the framework for endorsements is agreed upon. At that time a meeting will be convened with IQCS/IQS/ROSS and other stakeholders to move forward.
- 4. Discussion/decision regarding tightening guidelines on if/when competencies can be removed.
 - The competency table can be manipulated by end users currently
 - · Wondering if this presents an issue for records integrity
 - If training disappears (i.e. deleted) should the associated competency also be deleted (possibly automatically?)
 - Previous efforts to link competencies with training automatically raised concerns that data could be lost so the practice was abandoned.

Action: Guy will build a "removal warning" box to notify users when they remove a training for some reason, they should also consider removing the associated competency to ensure records are consistent in both tables.

- **5.** Discussion of course codes and the use of all the different ones in IQCS (particularly in light of EMI course codes, etc.)
 - The number of courses and unique course codes has increased markedly in IQCS
 - Course codes entered into IQCS should stick to the source naming convention as closely as possible
 - Naming conflicts are possible since we currently do not full control over naming conventions from external sources such as EMI
 - The list of course codes needs to be examined to so outdated course codes can be inactivated

Action: The group will examine the course code handout from Marley before the next meeting and identify which courses need to be considered for inactivation.

- **6.** <u>Discuss the FEMA F401 Training Needs Assessment report.</u>
 - Interested in having a report that highlights which training is missing for trainee responders.
 - Would be for required training only.
 - Report lists, per course, the responders that are missing a course. This would give account mangers/training officers a tool for course workload planning.
 - CMB board approved Training Needs Assessment for IQCS implementation.

Action: Marley will implement this request.

- 7. <u>Discussion/decision on whether or not we are planning on bringing the Needs Analysis and IRDP</u> modules back into a workable state.
 - A survey was sent out to assess who was using this feature and 13 responded that they were
 - Understand the FS has a regional mandate in R5 to use this feature.
 - Not clear if they are enforcing or intend to

Action: The FS needs to assess their needs with this feature and report back to the group if we should continue to have this feature in the upgraded version of IQCS.

- 8. <u>Discussion/decision on CMB change request form and on posting change requests on line</u>
 - The form would be for a change to the application or data
 - Must be 508 compliant
 - Form would be online
 - Possibly have CMB load completed forms online with supporting docs

Action: Prasad will demo how uploading completed documents would work on his next trip to Boise.

- Once in place, the HelpDesk will point people to the new online form when appropriate
 - If requested change affects one person = help ticket
 - If requested change affects many people = CMB request

Action: Modifications made during the meeting will be added to the form and distributed to the group for final approval by Russ in July.

- **9.** Inclusion of IMETs in IQCS. Update and discussion on progress and how best to accommodate the needs of non-IQCS groups who may/will become involved in incident response.
 - NOAA personnel that participate in incident management response are having some issues
 - Having some issues teaching the x90 series courses
 - Don't always have M-410 to meet teaching prerequisites
 - · Problems checking in at incidents
 - Currently have 83 certified fire IMETs
 - Have other emergency response meteorologists who are interested in being available to be mobilized to incidents (fire and/or non-fire)
 - Issues to be considered before putting additional METs in the system
 - Not sure about #'s of NOAA personnel, could impact license count if too high
 - An MOU that spelled out a threshold for non-contributing users would work

- Larry/Heath/Robyn suggested adding language to an existing agreement to at least document the relationship
 - Interagency Agreement for Meteorological and other Technical Services

Action: Russ will provide Heath with specifics to populate the existing agreement with details about use of IQCS.

Rhonda will provide Heath with numbers, possibly up to 200.

- The NOAA setid will be used for all IMETs
 - Larry will work to move IMETs currently listed under other agencies to the NOAA setid
- If we decide to include training requirements for IMETs as part of their setid qualification pathways, NWS has a directive that provides that information

10. Discussion on H337 providing more than one training certificate

- Completion of H337 allows for awarding up three certificates
 - · H337, I300, I400
- Course is already created in IQCS
- Completion of the course does not automatically award all three training competencies.
- Documentation that determined H337 is supposed to also award I300/I400:
 - IPGQ page E-2
 - Both the NPS and FWS allow awarding all three certificates based on an agency equivalency determination that was conducted by the agencies in 2009/2010.
 - Per an email from Tony 5/5, 'H-337 awarding a competency for 300/400, occasionally some only pass one portion of the course so we should keep these separate. Those who pass everything, get a cert for all three.'
